Professor Hartmann will be coming to Columbia to talk to the students about localization and pitch perception. He graduated from Iowa State with an electrical engineering degree before attending Oxford University to study theoretical physics. He has been a fellow of the Acoustical Society of America, and served as Chair of the Musical Acoustics Committee. He also served as the Vice-Chair of the Acoustical Society. He has been doing work in Psychoacoustics and Signal Processing for over 30 years, and continues to do research to this day. He is now a professor at Michigan State University in the Department of Physics and Astronomy.
