The victim was a female who was using the ATM at the MB Bank on the corner of Harrison Street and State Street. The unknown offender stopped behind her on the sidewalk and with no provocation, karate kicked the victim in the face. The following description was provided:

**DESCRIPTION:**

African American male, 6' tall, medium build, wearing a black leather jacket with lettering and a picture sewn into the back, the sleeves had a light colored band around the top; a gold shirt was hanging lower than the jacket, blue jeans and light colored shoes.

**SUGGESTED PRECAUTIONS:**

Always maintain a state of awareness to those around you.  
When using an ATM machine, be alert to people watching, lingering or approaching you.
