#### THIS INFORMATION SHEET

### **BEFORE YOU GO**

Don't pack that suitcase just yet! The following tasks will need to be completed before you leave Chicago:

- ADVISING: Visit College Advising to perform an academic self-audit. Are you on track to graduate? If you are returning to Chicago, how will the SiLA credits contribute to your major? If you are graduating after this semester, you need to perform a "graduation audit" with Advising. If you were conditionally admitted, we will need a note from your Academic Advisor clearing you for SiLA registration.
- <u>Career Center:</u> Meet with the Career Center. There is a career counselor assigned to
  each major. S/he will give you an overview of the internship program; help you obtain
  business cards; have your reel, resume and cover letter reviewed; create a website;
  and learn strategies on how to find an internship and a career job. You can make an
  appointment on **Handshake**, the college's employment site. Look specifically for a
  "SiLA" appointment.
- <u>Columbia Central</u>: For students who have taken out loans during their time at CCC, you are required to have "exit counseling" with ColumbiaCentral before you can receive your diploma. Please make an in-person appointment with them before you leave Chicago.
- Health Insurance: There is no Student Health in Los Angeles. Students must be covered by appropriate health insurance or purchase such insurance through Columbia College Chicago.
- <u>Graduation:</u> If SiLA will be your last semester, apply for undergraduate graduation on the Graduation Application link on the student Oasis page at: <a href="https://students.colum.edu/commencement/graduation-application.php">https://students.colum.edu/commencement/graduation-application.php</a>

#### REGISTRATION

SiLA follows the same academic calendar as Chicago: 15 weeks in fall/spring and 10 weeks in the summer. Our start/end dates are the same. **The only exception is that we don't have a Spring Break in Los Angeles**. This allows you to check-out of housing and return to Chicago a week early to be part of commencement activities.

You must be a full-time student while at SiLA, which means being enrolled in 12 credits during the academic year and 6 credits in the summer. You have been pre-authorized to register for SiLA courses and may do so during your normally scheduled time. **You must enroll yourself.** We authorize, but you enroll.

Courses will be first-come, first-served, so register early for best selection.

SiLA courses change every semester but all students are required to enroll in these 6 credits: Los Angeles Internship (COLL 232 & MEDI 335 – must be taken concurrently)

During the fall/spring semesters, students must also enroll in:

LA Speakers Series (CINE 262)

Fall/Spring students should choose 1-2 additional courses from the SiLA schedule to reach the 12-credit minimum; current schedules can be viewed at colum.edu/SiLA.

#### **HOUSING**

Columbia College offers housing at Park La Brea, a 160-acre gated community in the Miracle Mile district of Los Angeles. It's centrally located, approximately two miles from the SiLA classrooms and offices at Sunset Las Palmas Studios, and offers easy access to museums, shopping, entertainment, and public transportation.

While you are not required to live at Park La Brea, we strongly encourage it, as it enhances the immersive experience with various social and networking opportunities. We have found students living on their own often feel Los Angeles to be expensive and isolating.

Typically, students move into Park La Brea the Thursday before classes begin and depart the weekend after internships/courses end.

There is a complete Housing Information document on the SiLA Student Dashboard. The accompanying housing applications are due approximately three weeks after acceptance into SiLA.

#### COSTS

SiLA students are subject to the same tuition and fees Columbia charges all full-time students at its main campus. **In addition**, there is a SiLA program fee for the semester-long programs. This fee is set by Columbia's Board of Directors annually, so please check the SiLA website for your semester: <a href="https://www.colum.edu/academics/semester-in-la/costs">https://www.colum.edu/academics/semester-in-la/costs</a>.

If you are a non-degree-seeking student, you will be charged a non-degree fee of \$50 for domestic students and \$100 for international students.

The Ventra U-Pass is not available in Los Angeles and will be credited back to your account after the semester starts.

All SiLA-specific scholarships were announced upon SiLA acceptance. However, the Columbia Internship Award is administered by the Career Center and ALL current Columbia students should apply. To qualify you do not need an internship, but the *intent* to do an internship. While you are living in Los Angeles, you will need money for food, transportation, and entertainment. We estimate that students spend approximately \$500 a month for personal living, though that amount can vary depending on your individual lifestyle.

#### **INTERNSHIPS**

We see an internship as a natural bridge between the classroom and the professional world. In this town where networking is king, an internship gives you a leg up on other college graduates, putting you in front of decision-makers and allowing you to put your best foot forward.

The onus of finding an internship rests with YOU. Both the Career Center and SiLA are here to assist you, <u>but you must do the leg work</u>.

Almost all SiLA students commit to an internship before arriving in Los Angeles. Most of the high-profile internships are very competitive and select their interns' **months in advance.** They typically do Zoom or Skype interviews for finalists. So, **apply early**. Start your search now!

Check the Important Dates website for the mandatory internship presentation date. After attending, you will be enrolled in a Canvas site that will give you the tools you'll need to apply to internships and plenty of leads to follow.
