Estimated Program Costs

Columbia's **European Devised Performance Practice MFA** program offers a practice-based international theatre experience in the fields of physical theatre and devised performance. You'll take courses in Chicago and Berlin, Germany, that focus on creating original works for the stage, drawing inspiration from dance, the visual arts, and traditional theatre.

To earn an MFA in European Devised Performance Practice, you must complete 51 credits.

The below chart reflects the typical costs of a full-time student in this program:

- The estimated **direct expenses** include tuition and fees for the program based on 2021–22 tuition rates. Tuition rates are subject to annual increases. You will be billed by Columbia for direct expenses after you register for each semester of the program.
- The estimated **indirect expenses** reflect the average cost of attending college full time in Chicago in year 1 of the program and in Berlin in year 2 of the program. This includes estimates for books and supplies, room and board, and transportation. You will not be billed by Columbia for indirect expenses, and your actual expenses may vary.
- The first year of your program will be in Chicago, Illinois, and the second year of your program will be in Berlin, Germany. The specific start date will be confirmed by the program director.
